QUESTION OF THE WEEK/REFLECTION

Abortion and the 5th Commandment: Thou Shall Not Kill

On January 22, 2021, the Catholic Church in the United States prayed for the end of abortion on the anniversary of 'Roe v. Wade' the Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion in the U.S. Consequently, this decision has led to different movements in both political and social spheres, such as 'The Pro-Choice Movement.' While the movement seems to defend a 'basic natural human right,' which is freedom; it is implicitly trying to usurp a power that does not pertain to human beings, that is, power over life and death. Revelation tells us that God is the only one who can grant life or take it, "I have set before you life and death," (Dt 30:19) and 'When the king of Israel read the letter, he tore his clothes and said, "Am I God, to give death or life, that this man sends word to me to cure a man of his leprosy?"' (2 K 5:7). The 5th commandment as the Catechism explains, is based on the sacredness of human life, which is a gift where God is the giver and we the gifted. Therefore, any form of direct attack on an innocent human being is a rejection of God's gift and law (CCC 2258). Intentional homicide, abortion, euthanasia, and suicide fall under the category of "direct attack" on an innocent human being, which makes them all equally evil.

While it is true that there are many different circumstances that may influence someone's conscience and will to choose any of these attacks, none of these circumstances minimize the evil of the act, "the means do not justify the end." This does not mean that the Church disregards the circumstances, which may influence any women and men from choosing to directly attack an innocent life or to make them feel guilt, shame, pain, or isolation from God and others. Rather, the Church as both a Mother and Teacher, looks to comfort and form our consciences according to God's divine plan. Again, movements such as that of 'Pro-Choice,' promote a form of freedom in a "culture of death," which as St. John Paul II rightly stated, 'betrays a completely individualistic concept of freedom, which ends up by becoming the freedom of "the strong" against the weak who have no choice but to submit' (Evangelium Vitae 19).

Nevertheless, in a world that continues to separate itself from God and the light of faith, the Church, the visible body of Christ, is called to make present the face of God and of his light. Let us pray for the Church & humanity.
