QUESTION OF THE WEEK/REFLECTION

What is the meaning of Lent?

The time of Lent is upon us again, and this peitential time always begins with Ash Wednesday. The Church places ashes on our heads and invites us to enter a time of prayer and repentance. For forty days we are given an opportunity to prepare our hearts for the greatest and most important solemnity of the year, Easter! At Easter we celebrate the day in which our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ conquered death through the power of His resurrection. The "resurrection" is the greatest part of what is called "the Paschal Mystery," but this joy that the Risen Lord brings could not happen without the first part of the Paschal Mystery, when Jesus willingly suffered his Passion and "Death." Thus, Lent is a time of dying for us also, which is also known as "mortification," because during this time we are called to die to, or rather, to put to death our sins and earthly desires, and to strive to conform our lives to Jesus in a deeper way.

Throughout the time of Lent we follow our Lord Jesus Christ into the desert. Where he prayed and fasted for forty days and was tempted by the devil. He was driven into the desert immediately after his baptism in the Jordan River when the Holy Spirit came down upon him. This is important because Jesus is the new Adam and showed himself to be the faithful and obedient servant who did not fall under temptation like our ancient ancestor did, and he completely carried out the divine will. Also, as the catechism tells us, Jesus, "vanquished the Tempter *for us*: "For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sinning." (Catechism #540)

Lent also reminds us of the forty years that the people of Israel spent in the desert. It was a time of discovery for them, where they learned who they were as they encountered temptations. It has been said that God took the people out of slavery in Egypt but more difficult was the task of taking Egypt out of the people. What does this mean? God did a great thing for his people; the life of slavery was cruel, and he liberated them, but the people had Egypt in their hearts. They liked all the nice things of Egypt and they wanted to return there, because they wanted to secure their lives. They wanted their comfort, and so much so, that they could not endure the slightest suffering. They were tempted to stone poor Moses at the first moment they discovered that they were in need of food or water. So, instead of trusting in God and following him, they rebelled and got angry, and they also whined a lot.

As we begin our own journey of Lent, let us also pray and ask the Lord to help us trust and love him more. There is this idea that we give up things, but the point is to free ourselves of earthly things that separate us from God. Have a Blessed Lent!
