QUESTION OF THE WEEK/REFLECTION

How does the devil work & how can we overcome him?

From the beginning of the Bible until its end, we find the influence of the devil throughout. It was revealed in the Book of Revelation that Satan and his apostate angels were cast out of heaven by St. Michael and his angels. We also learn that the devil was thrown down to earth. (Rev 12:7-10,12) We can understand this as the definite plan of God because, for there to be love, there must be free will. God gave all His creatures free will, and the devil chose to rebel against God. This is the origin of sin, because at the root of everything is the fact that all things on earth and in heaven were "loved" into existence by God the Father. Sin is to disobey the will of God, to rebel against God's plan. Like the angels, all mankind will find itself on one side or the other, which is either to freely choose to accept and follow God's plan for our life or not. We must choose daily, and we do choose with our actions, either following God or doing our own will.

To understand how the devil works is quite easy, but it also helps to understand the meaning of the name of "Satan" or "the devil." The origin of the name is the 'accuser,' and his purpose by accusing people is to divide humanity from God. It is usually the influence of the devil that makes a person want to curse and rebel against God when seemingly bad things happen in life. Faith gives us an answer, "God has a plan," and the devil also gives an answer, "God doesn't love you."

So how does the devil work? The devil works through temptations and through flattery. The devil always lies to us. As Jesus says in the Gospel of John, the nature of the devil is to lie and murder. (Jn 8:44) The lie of the devil is to convince us that we should be god of our own lives and decide everything for ourselves (aka. Original Sin). The temptation is always to think that we are justified and deserving of the best, or that we are poor victims and therefore deserve to get what we want, to have a little bit of gratification; to have some fun. The lies of the devil go back to the original lie, that God does not love us. It is formulated like this: "God doesn't love you, because if he did love you then He surely would not have allowed (Some event, death, or crisis, etc.) to happen in your life. The devil tempts human beings to fall into sin and then he accuses them saying, 'Do you not see what a wretched sinner you are?' 'How could you do that?' Sin destroys us and our relationship with God and others but we have hope.

Jesus himself overthrew the devil by his humility, by willingly dying on the Cross. He conquered all temptations and then shed his blood to destroy sin and death so that we could be free from sin. The truth is that we cannot overcome the devil on our own. It will be only through humility, which is to rely totally on God. Through a faith which is always assured of God's love, no matter what happens to us. A faith that encourages us to seek heaven and unity with God, and not to love our earthly life more than the life to come. How do we get this kind of faith? Prayer, and through the help of the Church and the sacraments, and freely choose to seek God every day.
