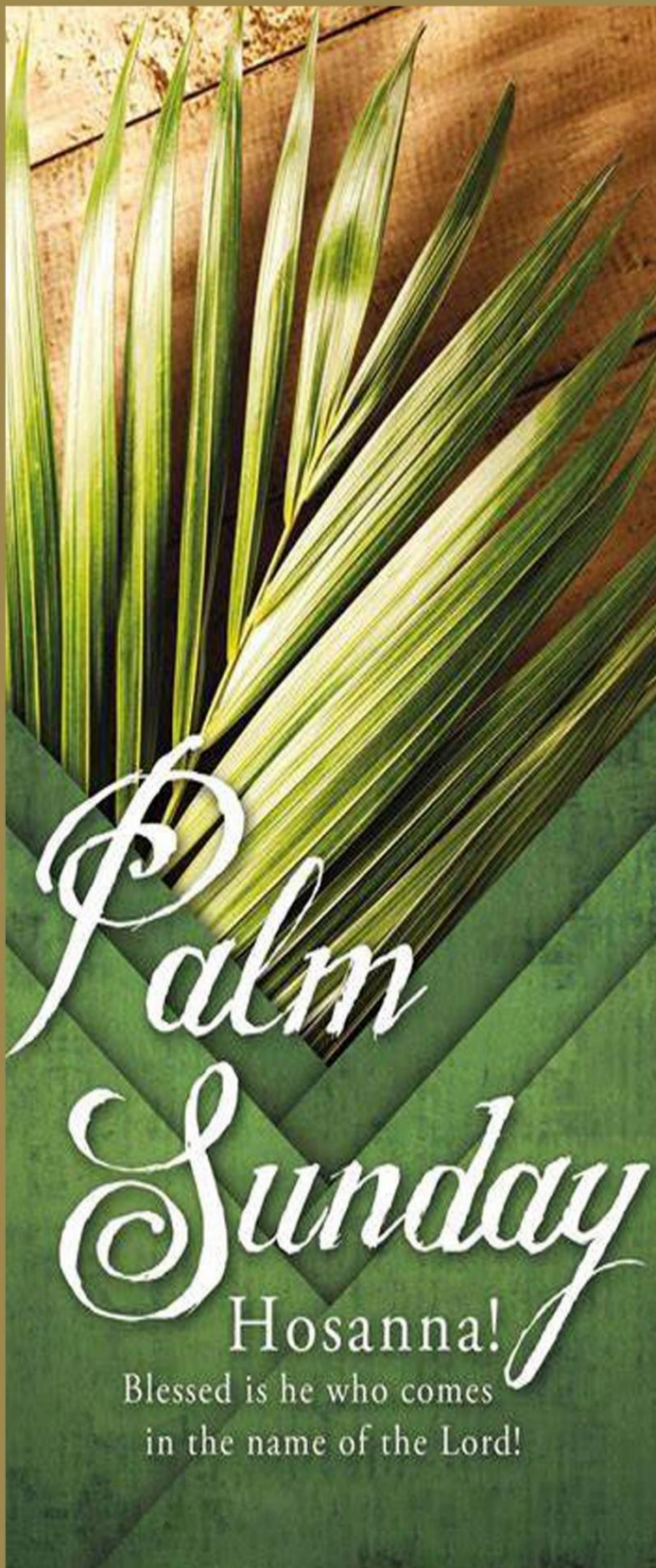

Readings and Reflection for this Sunday

Luke 19:28-40 Isaiah 50:4-7

Psalm 22:8-9,17-20,23-24 Philippians 2:6-11 Luke 22:14-23:56

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus is portrayed as active and vocal throughout his passion. When one of the disciples strikes the high priest's servant, Jesus heals the man, an event reported only in the Gospel of Luke. Jesus stops the disciples' protest against his arrest by noting that this is the "time for the power of darkness." Jesus engages and responds when brought before the Sanhedrin; his words speak about the "power of God" that will bring about the reign of the Son of Man. When questioned by Pilate, Jesus responds with just one phrase; yet before Herod, Jesus refuses to speak. When Luke describes the Way of the Cross and Jesus' crucifixion, he calls to our attention many events that are not reported in the other Gospels. Throughout his Gospel, Luke has paid heed to the women who accompanied Jesus. Now, on the road to Calvary, Jesus speaks to the women who walk with him. Only Luke reports Jesus' words of forgiveness spoken from the cross. And only Luke reports the dialogue between Jesus and the good thief. Finally, in contrast with the Gospels of Mark and Matthew, Luke reports no words of abandonment spoken by Jesus on the cross. Instead, Jesus, in full command until his death, commends his spirit to his Father and takes his final breath. Throughout Holy Week, we will continue to reflect on the events of Jesus' passion and death. As we meditate on the cross, we ask again and anew what it means to make the statement of faith that Jesus, in his obedient suffering and dying, revealed himself to us as God's Son and brought to fulfillment the Kingdom of God. Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week. The day recalls Jesus' triumphal entry into the city of our salvation that takes place about a week before his Resurrection (Easter).

Why do we wave palms?

When Jesus rode into Jerusalem, crowds greeted him by waving palms and covering his path with small branches. We wave palms today to hail Christ in his triumph for our salvation in the light of his Paschal Mystery - his Passion, Death and Resurrection.

Jesus enters Jerusalem. The crowd of disciples accompanies him in festive mood, their garments are stretched out before him, there is talk of the miracles he has accomplished, and loud praises are heard:

"Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"
(Luke 19:38)

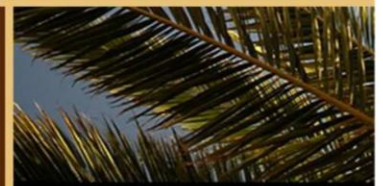

On Palm Sunday, priests will wear **red vestments** in keeping with the Church's focus on the Lord's glorious Passion



Traditionally, before the beginning of Lent the following year, the palms are collected and burned to a fine ash. The ashes are blessed and used for the Ash Wednesday liturgy.



The Triduum - Triduum- We have been fasting for 40 days leading to Holy Week! The Triduum is 3 days long. Beginning Holy Thursday, includes Good Friday (the Lord's Passion/Death) and Holy Saturday. It ends on the Easter Vigil! **Holy Thursday** (the Last Supper, the Eucharist, Jesus washing the feet of the disciples) We remember the gifts of the priesthood and the Eucharist. The service ends with processing out solemnly to spend some quiet time with Jesus in adoration. We accompany Jesus as He begins His Passion, or journey to the Cross. **Good Friday**-(Passion and venerate the Cross) Mass is not offered this day, instead we gather for the Liturgy. We listen as the Passion is proclaimed; we venerate the Cross and we receive the Eucharist that was consecrated on Holy Thursday. We recognize Jesus' death and descent into the dead on this day. **Holy Saturday** - On this quiet day we reflect on everything that has happened the past two days, waiting for the Resurrection. In the evening we celebrate the Easter Vigil. Focus on: fire, word, water, and bread. The Easter candle represents Christ, who brought light into the world and dispels the darkness of sin. We listen to the history of salvation through the readings of the Old Testament and the narrative of the Resurrection. Following the homily, Baptisms take place and we renew our own Baptismal Promises (*listen to what you are promising*). We are sprinkled with the water as the joy of Easter begins. Then we begin the Liturgy of the Eucharist, Jesus, the Bread that fills our souls. Welcome to those entering the Church.

Lecturas y Reflexión para este Domingo *Lucas 19:28-40 Isaías 50:4-7 Salmo 22:8-9,17-20,23-24 Filipenses 2:6-11 Lucas 22:14-23:56*

En el Evangelio de Lucas, Jesús es retratado como activo y vocal a lo largo de su pasión. Cuando uno de los discípulos golpea al siervo del sumo sacerdote, Jesús sana al hombre, un evento que solo se relata en el Evangelio de Lucas. Jesús detiene la protesta de los discípulos contra su arresto señalando que este es el "tiempo del poder de las tinieblas". Jesús se involucra y responde cuando es llevado ante el Sanedrín; sus palabras hablan del "poder de Dios" que llevará a cabo el reinado del Hijo del Hombre. Al ser interrogado por Pilato, Jesús responde con una sola frase; sin embargo, ante Herodes, Jesús se niega a hablar. Cuando Lucas describe el Vía Crucis y la crucifixión de Jesús, llama nuestra atención sobre muchos acontecimientos que no se relatan en los otros Evangelios. A lo largo de su Evangelio, Lucas ha prestado atención a las mujeres que acompañaban a Jesús. Ahora, en el camino al Calvario, Jesús habla a las mujeres que caminan con él. Solo Lucas relata las palabras de perdón de Jesús pronunciadas desde la cruz. Y sólo Lucas relata el diálogo entre Jesús y el buen ladrón. Finalmente, en contraste con los Evangelios de Marcos y Mateo, Lucas no reporta palabras de abandono pronunciadas por Jesús en la cruz. En cambio, Jesús, en pleno mando hasta su muerte, encomienda su espíritu a su Padre y da su último aliento. A lo largo de la Semana Santa, continuaremos reflexionando sobre los acontecimientos de la pasión y muerte de Jesús. Al meditar en la cruz, nos preguntamos una y otra vez qué significa hacer la declaración de fe de que Jesús, en su sufrimiento y muerte obedientes, se reveló a nosotros como Hijo de Dios y llevó a cabo el Reino de Dios.

El Triduo - El Triduo ¡Hemos estado ayunando durante 40 días antes de la Semana Santa! El Triduo dura 3 días y abarca los tiempos de Cuaresma y Pascua. Comienza el Jueves Santo con la Misa de La Cena del Señor e incluye el Viernes Santo (la Pasión/Muerte del Señor) y el Sábado Santo. Termina en el ¡Vigilia Pascual! **Jueves Santo** (incluye la Última Cena, la Eucaristía, Jesús lava los pies de los discípulos) recordamos el don del sacerdocio, el don de la Eucaristía y el mandamiento del amor desinteresado por todos. El servicio termina con la asamblea saliendo solemnemente para pasar un tiempo tranquilo con Jesús en adoración. Nosotros acompañar a Jesús en el comienzo de su Pasión, o viaje ala Cruz. **Viernes Santo**-(Pasión leída y venerada la Cruz) Este día no se ofrece misa, sino que nos reunimos para la liturgia. Escuchamos mientras se proclama la Pasión; veneramos la Cruz (el instrumento que sostuvo nuestra Salvación), y recibimos la Eucaristía que fue consagrada el Jueves Santo. Reconocemos la muerte de Jesús y su descenso a los muertos en este día. **Sábado Santo** - En este día tranquilo reflexionamos sobre todo lo que ha sucedido en los últimos dos días, esperando la Resurrección. Por la noche celebramos la Vigilia Pascual. Enfócate en: fuego, palabra, agua y pan. El cirio de Pascua representa a Cristo, que trajo luz al mundo y disipa las tinieblas del pecado. Escuchamos la historia de la salvación a través de las lecturas del Antiguo Testamento y la narración de la Resurrección. Después de la homilía, se llevan a cabo los Bautismos y renovamos nuestras propias Promesas Bautismales (escuchen lo que prometen) Somos rociados con el agua mientras comienza la alegría de la Pascua. Luego comenzamos la Liturgia de la Eucaristía, Jesús, el Pan que llena nuestras almas. También damos la bienvenida a los que entran en la Iglesia.
