HE IS ALIVE

Readings and Reflection for this Sunday

*Acts of the Apostles 5:12-16 Psalm 118:2-4,13-15,22-24 Revelation 1:9-19
John 20:19-31*

This Gospel combines two scenes: Jesus' appearance to his disciples after his Resurrection and Jesus' dialogue with Thomas, the disciple who doubted. Part of the mystery of Jesus' Resurrection is that he appeared to his disciples not as a spirit, but in bodily form. We do not know, however, exactly what this form looked like. Earlier in John's Gospel, when Mary of Magdala first encountered the risen Jesus, she did not recognize him until he spoke to her. In Luke's Gospel, the disciples walking along the road to Emmaus did not recognize Jesus until he broke bread with them. We know from readings such as today's that in his resurrected form, Jesus was not bound by matter; he appeared to the disciples inside a home even though the door was locked. Yet the disciples could still touch the marks of his Crucifixion.

In today's Gospel, Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun; as Jesus was sent by God, so Jesus sends his disciples. He gives his disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit so that they will be able to accomplish this task. Jesus' words to his disciples also highlight the integral connection between the forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit. With the grace of the Holy Spirit, we can share forgiveness and reconciliation with others. Thomas, the doubting disciple in today's reading, represents the reality of the Church that comes after this first community of witnesses to Jesus. All but the first disciples of Jesus must believe without seeing. Like Thomas, we may doubt the news that Jesus, who was crucified and buried, appeared to his disciples. Our human nature seeks hard evidence that the Jesus who appeared to his disciples after his death is indeed the same Jesus who was crucified. Thomas is given the opportunity to be our representative in obtaining this evidence. He gives witness to us that the Jesus who was raised is the same Jesus who died. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are among those who are blessed, for we have not seen and yet believe. Loyola Press

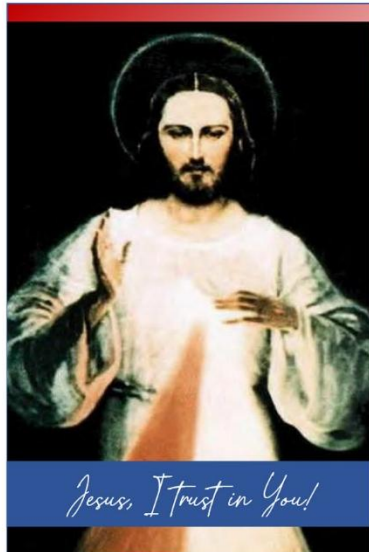

Divine Mercy: Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter. It started with the private revelations of St. Faustina Kowalska, which recommended a particular devotion to Divine Mercy. She was asked to keep a notebook with her conversations with God (Diary 459). In February of 1931, Sr. Faustina sees a vision of the Lord Jesus, who asks her to have an image painted according to the pattern she sees, writing on the bottom "Jesus, I trust in You!" The image of Jesus has a red ray and a blue ray coming out of his heart. One symbolizes water, and one symbolizes blood. Jesus taught her the prayers we know today as the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. Jesus promises: Conversion of sinners when the Chaplet is said on their behalf. Those who recite the Chaplet will receive great mercy at the hour of death. Souls who spread the honor of His Mercy will be shielded their entire lives and at the hour of death, Jesus will not be the Judge, but rather the Merciful Savior. In three places in her Diary, St. Faustina records our Lord's promises of specific, extraordinary graces: ***I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy*** (1109). ***Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment*** (300). ***The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment*** (699). To receive these graces, the only condition is to receive Holy Communion worthily on Divine Mercy Sunday (or the Vigil celebration), by making a good confession within 7 days of Divine Mercy Sunday, and staying in the state of grace and trusting in His Divine Mercy. By these conditions, our Lord is emphasizing the value of **Confession** and **Holy Communion** as miracles of mercy. The "Divine Mercy Chaplet" is a prayer that can be prayed using a rosary. It's traditional to pray a Divine Mercy novena, which starts on Good Friday and ends on Divine Mercy Sunday. Listen to this easy explanation on FORMED: (copy to your browser)

Lecturas y Reflexión para este Domingo

Hechos de los Apóstoles 5:12-16 Salmo 118:2-4,13-15,22-24
Apocalipsis 1:9-19 Juan 20:19-31

Este Evangelio combina dos escenas: la aparición de Jesús a sus discípulos después de su resurrección y el diálogo de Jesús con Tomás, el discípulo que dudaba. Parte del misterio de la resurrección de Jesús es que se apareció a sus discípulos no como un espíritu, sino en forma corporal. No sabemos, sin embargo, exactamente cómo era esta forma. Anteriormente en el Evangelio de Juan, cuando María Magdalena se encontró por primera vez con Jesús resucitado, no lo reconoció hasta que él le habló. En el Evangelio de Lucas, los discípulos que caminaban por el camino de Emaús no reconocieron a Jesús hasta que partió el pan con ellos. Sabemos por lecturas como la de hoy que en su forma resucitada, Jesús no estaba limitado por la materia; Se apareció a los discípulos dentro de una casa a pesar de que la puerta estaba cerrada con llave. Sin embargo, los discípulos aún podían tocar las marcas de su Crucifixión. En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús saluda a sus discípulos con el don de la paz. Entonces Jesús encarga a sus discípulos que continúen la obra que él ha comenzado; así como Jesús fue enviado por Dios, así Jesús envía a sus discípulos. Él da a sus discípulos el don del Espíritu Santo para que puedan llevar a cabo esta tarea. Las palabras de Jesús a sus discípulos también resaltan la conexión integral entre el perdón de los pecados y el don del Espíritu Santo. Con la gracia del Espíritu Santo, podemos compartir el perdón y la reconciliación con los demás. Tomás, el discípulo escéptico en la lectura de hoy, representa la realidad de la Iglesia que viene después de esta primera comunidad de testigos de Jesús. Todos, excepto los primeros discípulos de Jesús, deben creer sin ver. Al igual que Tomás, podemos dudar de la noticia de que Jesús, que fue crucificado y sepultado, se apareció a sus discípulos. Nuestra naturaleza humana busca pruebas contundentes de que el Jesús que se apareció a sus discípulos después de su muerte es en realidad el mismo Jesús que fue crucificado. A Thomas se le da la oportunidad de ser nuestro representante en la obtención de esta evidencia. Él nos da testimonio de que el Jesús que resucitó es el mismo Jesús que murió. Por el don del Espíritu Santo, estamos entre los bendecidos, porque no hemos visto y sin embargo creemos. Loyola Press

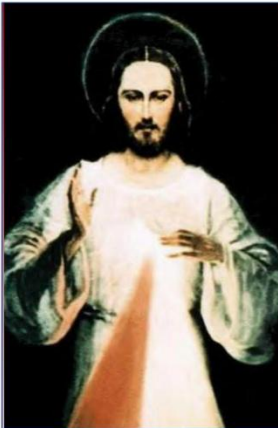

Jesus, en ti Confío!

Divina Misericordia: El Domingo de la Divina Misericordia se celebra el Segundo Domingo de Pascua. Comenzó con las revelaciones privadas de Santa Faustina Kowalska, que recomendaba una devoción a la Divina Misericordia. Se le pidió que llevara un cuaderno con sus conversaciones con Dios (Diario 459). En febrero de 1931, Sor Faustina tiene una visión del Señor Jesús, que pregunta que le pinten una imagen de acuerdo con el patrón que ve, escribiendo en la parte inferior "Jesús, yo ¡Confía en Ti!" La imagen de Jesús tiene un rayo rojo y otro azul que salen de su corazón. Uno simboliza el agua, y uno simboliza la sangre. Jesús le enseñó las oraciones que hoy conocemos como la Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia. Jesús promete: Conversión de los pecadores cuando se reza la Coronilla en su nombre. Los que reciten la Coronilla recibirán una gran misericordia en la hora de la muerte. que difunden el honor de Su Misericordia serán protegidos toda su vida y en la hora de la muerte, Jesús no será el Juez, sino el Salvador Misericordioso. En tres lugares de su Diario, St. Faustina records our Lord's promises of specific, extraordinary graces: **Quiero conceder un perdón total a las almas que se confesarán y recibirán la Sagrada Comunión el día Fiesta de mi misericordia** (1109). **Quien se acerque a la Fuente de la Vida en este día se le concederá perdón completo de los pecados y castigo** (300). **El alma que irá a la Confesión y recibir la Sagrada Comunión obtendrá el perdón completo de los pecados y el castigo** (699). Para recibir estas gracias, la única condición es recibir la Sagrada Comunión dignamente el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia (o la celebración de la Vigilia), haciendo una buena confesión dentro de los 7 días del Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, y permaneciendo en estado de gracia y confiando en Su Divina Misericordia. Con estas condiciones, nuestro Señor está enfatizando el valor de la **Confesión** y la **Sagrada Comunión** como milagros de misericordia. La "Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia" es una oración que se puede rezar con un rosario. Es tradicional rezar una novena de la Divina Misericordia, que comienza el Viernes Santo y termina el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. Indulgencia plenaria y Divina Misericordia: Se puede obtener una indulgencia plenaria yendo a una iglesia el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia "con un espíritu que está completamente desapegado del afecto por un pecado, incluso un pecado venial", y participando en las oraciones celebradas en honor a la Divina Misericordia, dice el decreto de 2002. Esas prácticas podrían consistir en devociones como la Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia, la Adoración Eucarística y el Sacramento de la Confesión. Los fieles también podían visitar el Santísimo Sacramento, ya sea expuesto o en el tabernáculo y recitar el Padre Nuestro, el Credo de Nicea y una oración devota a Cristo. El ejemplo de una oración devota que se da en el decreto es "¡Jesús misericordioso, en ti confío!" Para recibir la indulgencia, también se deben cumplir las tres condiciones habituales de ir a la Confesión, recibir la Sagrada Comunión y rezar por las intenciones del Santo Padre. Si bien es apropiado que los dos sacramentos se reciban el mismo día, la Iglesia permite que se reciban hasta unos 20 días antes o después del día en que se realiza la obra de indulgencia. Se debe animar a todos los participantes a realizar alguna obra especial de misericordia ese mismo día.
